HAPPY NEW YEAR!

No I haven't completely lost my marbles, at least not yet. This is the beginning of a New Year for the Church. We begin a new cycle, 'cycle A' in our readings and we change our Gospel to St. Matthew for this coming year.

New Year's are about new beginnings, fresh starts and resolutions. For us this Advent we are invited to come and go up to the house of the Lord. To seek him out, to find time to spend with him, to be renewed in the promise of his return.

Advent is a time of hope, of waiting, of looking forward to dawn of the new light upon the world. It is a time of God's promise fulfilled in the person of Jesus. We are invited to leave the darkness of winter behind us and look to the coming light of Christ.



Advent is above all a time of preparation, or getting ready to meet the Lord when he comes. For the first three weeks we are looking forward to when, as he promised, he would come again. Our final week of preparation from the 17th of December is a time to prepare us, to remember, when the Lord first came among us at Christmas.

Let us hear again the call in the Gospel, to 'Stay Awake', to stand ready that we will have an open heart to greet the Lord on his re-

turn. His return we are told will come at an hour we do not expect. Let us then, make a resolution, in the midst of our very busy lives, to prepare our hearts, to welcome the Lord when he comes.



The Advent Wreath

Most churches and families have an Advent Wreath. The custom wasn't always an Irish one. Wreaths were popular in Germany, Austria and





Northern Europe. As people began to travel to these countries they saw the attractive wreaths and brought the idea home. As you see we have one here in the Church this week end. It is a symbol of what Advent means.

The circle represents "eternity" and the "faithfulness" of God, it never ends. The evergreen foliage is a reminder that Jesus is ready to renew our relationship with Him. The Four Candles represent the four weeks of Advent and each Sunday one is lit. Three **purple** candles and one **rose** colour. Purple is the traditional colour for Advent meaning "Penance" and the Rose colour in lit on the third Sunday which is Gaudete Sunday, or a day of **Rejoicing** that the coming of Jesus is near.

So Advent is a time for us to prepare to receive Jesus into our hearts, our lives, our homes and our parish. We need to invite Him. A very short traditional prayer for Advent is simply "COME LORD JESUS"

We can say this at any time, travelling, in the house or when we pass a Church or Grotto. Having the Advent Wreath in the house it could be said with children round the wreath, maybe at bedtime or before a meal. Remember when we invite Jesus into our lives He will never come empty handed. He will come to you with some special gift or blessing, something He knows you need. But you have to be **READY** and **WAITING.** So "Stay awake" "Be ready" so that He Knows you're expecting Him.
