Hold them in your heart this Lent

Trócaire writes.....

Around the world, families are living under constant threat of conflict, drought and land grabs. In the face of those threats, many women hold their families together, battling enormous odds to provide for their children. Lent 2020 highlights the different ways in which women overcome the odds to keep their families safe from harm. This Lent, we are focusing on two f amilies, one in Kenya and one in Honduras, to highlight how mothers work to protect their families and communities from the devastating impact of climate change and from the actions of corporations. Madris and Angela are two such women. We think of them and women like them all over the world this Lent.

Madris can no longer depend on growing enough food or generating enough income from her crops to survive. She has to rely on rearing chickens and goats, and engaging in casual labour such as collecting and selling firewood. Without a steady income, Madris struggles to feed her family and to pay the children's school fees.

In the face of these challenges, Madris draws on her inner strength and resilience. She is an Anglican Christian and her faith is incredibly important to her. When asked how she finds the strength to care for her family in such challenging circumstances, she doesn't hesitate to say, 'I draw my strength from God because I am Christian. I pray to God. God helps me to teach good values to my family.' Prayer is a very important practice for Madris and her family. They end each day by praying together. When times are difficult, Madris turns to prayer. 'I have a lot of faith in God, and even on the days that I can't pay school fees, I pray to God and he provides. We pray a lot for rainfall, at church and even at community meetings.'

St. Patrick Patron of Ireland

It can be difficult to separate fact from fiction in the life of St. Patrick, not unusual when he was probably born more than 1,600 years ago. His life is a wonderful example of how God brings good out of evil. He tells us in his "confessions" how he was brought to Ireland to work as a slave at the age of sixteen, until that time he had little knowledge of God.



In his loneliness and isolation he discovered the Lord, praying as many as 1000 prayers by day and the same by night as he tended the sheep on Sliabh Migh. Finally escaping, proba-

bly to France, he could not forget the needs of the pagans in Ireland.

He was consecrated bishop at the age of forty three.

In a dream it seemed the people of Ireland were calling on him to return. Patrick took this as a call from God and lit a flame on the hill of *Tara* on *Holy* Saturday night which has never since been extinguished.

Pope Francis Anniversary

Pope Francis celebrated the seventh Anniversary of his election as **Bishop of** Rome and leader of the Catholic Church on March 13th.

Born in Argentina and the first Jesuit pope. He became cardinal in 2001 and elected pope in 2013, taking Francis as his papal name.
