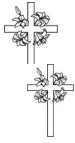

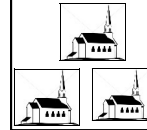

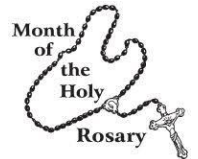

## Month of Mission and Rosary

October along with being '*Mission Month*' is also the *Month Dedicated to the Rosary*. In years past there was a wonderful Irish tradition of reciting the Rosary daily in our homes. The Rosary from the Latin word rosarium, meaning, 'Crown of Roses' is a form of prayer. It is divided into four parts and each having five mysteries.



**October 7th is the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary**, also known as Our Lady of the Most Holy Rosary.

It was formerly known as the Feast of Our Lady of Victory and changed by Pope Gregory XI in 1573.

In 1716 Pope Clement XI inserted it into the Roman Catholic calendar of Saints, and assigned it to the first Sunday of October.

Pope Pius X changed the date to October 7th in 1913, as part of his effort to restore celebration of the liturgy of the Sundays.

On October 13th, 1917 *Our lady of Fatima* told the children, **"I am the Lady of the Rosary"**

We may be familiar with the *Joyful, Sorrowful and Glorious Mysteries* but, perhaps less so with the *Mysteries of Light*.

These were introduced by Pope John Paul.

The Rosary can be a difficult prayer to pray and concentrate on. Beginning this month of October we encourage you and your families **to begin by saying just one decade or more**. Each decade is **one Our Father, ten Hail Marys and Glory Be** to the Father. Rosary beads or a rosary ring are an aid towards saying the Rosary in the proper sequence.

## Purpose of Church Envelopes?

There are a variety of **envelopes** used for church collections, many people may be unaware about *which is for what purpose*.

In any parish there are two purposes for which money is collected.

PARISH INCOME (maintain parish)  
PRIEST INCOME (personal income)

### Parish Income comes from:-

Saturday/Sunday collections  
Holyday collections  
Standing Orders  
Direct Debits  
Annual cheques, donations, drafts/  
postal orders, bequests.  
Tax Refund Scheme and Graves.

### Parish Income is primarily used for:

Altar supplies (breads, wines, candles,  
altar linen, church cleaning;  
Church Heating:- Electricity/Gas/Oil;  
Insurance; Postage, stationery, telephone;  
Sacristans & secretarial payments;  
Repairs & maintenance of churches and  
presbytery;  
Diocesan Levies

(8% & 10% contributions)

Two church collections go to the priest as  
part of their income. The collection on:-  
**Christmas Day & Easter Sunday**

### Priests Income

The priest is not paid a salary from the parish but receives income from **voluntary offerings** of parishioners. The way these are collected can vary from parish to parish.
