Finance Committee submits

Offertory Envelopes 2026

The 2026 boxed sets of offertory envelopes for existing users will be available after all Masses next weekend, December 6th/7th. They will be available for new users on December 13th/14th. The Parish Finance Committee encourages those who already use the envelope system to collect them, and also that new users would begin using them next year.

The parish, as a registered charity, can claim extra income from the Revenue Commissioners if tax-paying donors give a minimum of 250Euro for 2026. In 2024, the parish received 10, 313Euro through this Charitable Donation Scheme. The Parish Finance Committee hopes to increase this amount by encouraging more people to participate.

Some donors contribute to the parish by means of bank Standing Orders and, similarily, if they are taxpayers, they can also be part of the Charitable Donation Scheme.

Season of Advent

In the church calendar, the four weeks before Christmas are known as Advent; a time of waiting and preparation. This Sunday is the *First Sunday of Advent* and you will notice the *Advent Wreath* in the church.

Sometimes in the hustle and bustle of the weeks leading up to Christmas it is easy to lose sight of what we are preparing for. As you get ready at this special time of the year, perhaps you and your family will make a conscious effort to be more aware of the true meaning of the celebration of Christmas - the birth of the Christ Child.



We can use this time to make spiritual preparation for Christmas.

The custom of the Advent Wreath is an excellent way for families to keep the real meaning of Christmas in perspective.

The Advent Wreath consists of a circle of evergreens and four candles.

The **circular shape** symbolises God's love for us, a love that has no beginning or end. **The evergreens** represent the continuing and everlasting life that comes from God through Jesus. As we light the candles each week we are made aware of our journey through this season from Advent to Christmas.

The four candles (three purple and a pink/rose colour) mark four weeks of Advent and point to Jesus as the light of the world. **The purple candles** show that Advent is a time of waiting and preparation.



The **pink/rose candle lit** on the third week *(Gaudete Sunday)* reminds us we can rejoice as we draw near to Christmas.

An Advent Wreath in the home can be a wonderful opportunity for family prayer.

As we light our first candle this week we pray for God's blessing of the Advent wreath, our homes and each of us. Amen.
