Mothers Day in Ireland?

The history of celebrating **Mothering Sunday or Mothers Day** in Ireland can be traced to the medieval practice where children from poor families were sent to work as domestic servants and apprentices to work with the rich. Once in the year in the middle of **Lent** the children were given a day off to visit their 'Mother Church' and worship the Virgin Mary. After visiting the Mother Church or Cathedral of their home town these children visited their mothers and presented them with flowers they picked along the way. Some girls baked a special Mothering Cake on the day.



Patterns of living changed after the Industrial Revolution and Mothering Sunday celebrations almost lapsed. The custom was revived after World War 11.

We now celebrate Mothers Day on the fourth Sunday of Lent.

On this day people present their mothers with cards, flowers and other gifts to express love and gratitude.

Daffodil Day March

Daffodil Day March 11th, 2016 is the biggest and longest running fundraising day for the Irish Cancer

Society, Ireland's national cancer charity. Irelands *first*

Daffodil Day was held in 1988.

Charles Cully, a founder member was visiting friends in Toronto, Canada in 1987 where he met the daughter of one of the founders of Toronto Daffodil Day.

She recounted how a small group of volunteers got together to sell daffodils and started their first Daffodil Day.

Inspired by the concept he returned home to organise the *first Daffodil Day in 1988*.

On that first Daffodil Day hundreds of volunteers gathered at head quarters in Dublin to collect their daffodils for selling which had all been donated.

On *Daffodil Day* thousands of volunteers around Ireland come together and with kindness and generosity, help to raise millions of euro by selling pins, flowers etc. to raise funds for the Cancer Society's *free*, nationwide service for those with, and affected by, cancer in Ireland. A vital part of the work of the Irish Cancer Society involves helping those at the end of their cancer journey to die in their own home, surrounded by their loved ones. This service is carried out by the Night Nurses who provide care of the patients in their own home, giving them comfort, familiarity and dignity during their last nights and also provide help and support to their families.

Daffodil Day as well as fundraising is also a Day of Hope. It represents hope that we will never forget those who we have lost to cancer; hope that those affected by cancer will get the care they need; and hope that one day we will overcome cancer.

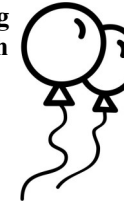
