We all love a good party, gathering together, meeting old friends, exchanging news, catching up. We are not meant to be alone. We are meant for company. We enjoy, even with one other person, sitting down and having a chat over a cuppa.

The prophet Isaiah, in his writings was trying always to be a person of hope. People needed encouragement and not to lose heart. He, in our reading this weekend, is painting a picture through his words. He is trying to describe the impossible; he is trying to describe what heaven will be like.

His word picture is of a wonderful heavenly celebration where the Lord triumph's over sin and death. It's a fabulous banquet, with nothing but the best food and wines. Team Hope Shoe Box Appeal

It is that time of year again when it is time to start planning **Team Hope Shoe Box Appeal in Ballinhassig Parish.**



It's been another difficult year for many economically, weatherwise, personal loss and tragedies, illness and bereavement, but for the children who receive your shoe box gift it will have an impact far greater than you can imagine, as well as all the great gifts, you will bring smiles laughter and hope to children who think the world has forgotten them.

Worldwide recession makes no difference to them, they live with recession and poverty all their life. They are forgotten children, victims of war, diseases and poverty, living on the edge in some of the poorest countries in the world. Christmas is just another ordinary day, nothing special, no Christmas tree, no presents. But your shoebox can bring a little hope and a practical expression of God's love at Christmas time. **A shoebox won't change the world, but it might just change the world for one child,** it can do far more than we can imagine, by bringing Christmas to children who have never experienced anything like it before.



The project simply works by asking people to fill an average sized shoe box or plastic container, **wrap the box and lid separately with Christmas paper.** This year boxes from Ireland will once again go to Eastern Europe and Africa. The boxes are given to children regardless of their nationality, political background or religious beliefs. Because it is Christmas, whenever it is culturally appropriate and in consultation with local people the children, along with their box may be offered a booklet telling the story of the nativity and the life of Jesus.

You choose whether you would like your box to go to a boy or girl and what age group, 2-4; 5-9; 10 -14.

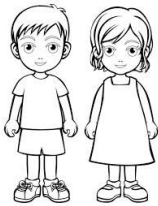
All boxes are opened by volunteers at the collection centres simply to check they are ok for contents and customs purposes. **(our boxes will go to a collection centre in Blackpool, Cork)** The boxes are then sealed, sent by truck or container and will only be opened again by the receiving child.

Boxes must be returned to the P.A.N. Centre (Parish Office), Cottrell's Gala, Ballinhassig or national schools by November 12th, 2017.

A great day was had by all, Parish Assembly members, parishioners and friends from outside the parish.

The sisters in **Glencairn** were out to welcome us on arrival and then we were treated to tea/ coffee homemade scones and confectionary and chat with the sisters. We visited their church where we were given a history of the sisters in Glencairn, we then joined in short prayer where we prayed for our families and the wider community. We had a walk to the farm where we saw their miscanthus bales and the large burner used to burn them which provides heat and water for their entire building. They were most welcoming and radiated an air of contentment and spirituality and were especially happy that we had two parish connections to their sisters in the visiting group, **Mairead Deasy**, Bawnleigh mother of **Sister Elizabeth** and **Sr. Marie** is sister of **Eileen Hanigan**, Ballygarvan.

We then moved on to **Mount Melleray** where we were greeted on arrival by Fr. Luke, enjoyed a beautiful lunch and then had time to do as we pleased. We visited the Heritage Centre; Gift shop; Café; had quiet time, walks in the grounds, visited church, confessions or went on the long walk through the wood to the Holy Cross. Later we all met with Fr. Luke who gave us some history of **Mount Melleray** and told us why he joined there etc. Again they were welcoming and appreciative of our visit despite they now only have eight priests. Once again the parish had links with them **Fr. Paul Hennessy** who was their **Abbot** for many years was a brother of **Humphrey Hennessy, Ballyheada;** and **Mary O'Halloran** had a grand uncle Brother Colman (Jim Walsh) who is buried in Melleray.

In both places we were enthused and inspired physically and spiritually by their warmth, generosity, hospitality, piety and spirituality.
