





Fr. Christy writes...

Practice what your Preach

Young people are very open, they are full of boundless energy, idealism, great dreams for the future, and thank God for it. One thing that young people can't stand is people who are not authentic, people who say one thing and then do the very opposite.

The scriptures this weekend remind us of the same thing. Being a Christian, being a believer, being a follower of Jesus means we have to follow through on our words. Christianity is about a way of life. It is to do with being at the service of others. It's about being a person who adds to the life of others makes their life better and not being a person who lays burdens on them.

It means that we have to reach out, think beyond this world and ourselves. That's the challenge we face. As our liturgical year draws to a close in the coming weeks we will be asked to look beyond this world and this time, to the future, the future that awaits all believers, in the next life.
